How to apply

Please apply for this job by sending a CV with details of your education, training and work experience, and a supporting statement of no more than three sides of A4.

Before writing your supporting statement, it is important that you read the job description and person specification carefully. A panel will shortlist candidates by comparing the information each candidate gives in their application to the points listed in the person specification. Those short-listed for interview will be the candidates who best demonstrate that they meet the points listed in the person specification.

Work, paid or voluntary, is not the only means of showing you meet the requirements of the post. You may also have acquired relevant knowledge and skills through your life experience. If so, please try to demonstrate how.
